On October 12, 2025, Government College, Nainbagh, organized an awareness program for farmers regarding coarse grains in Tipri Bazaar, Jakhnidhar Block, under the Chief Minister's Higher Education Research Promotion Scheme. The program was organized by the Principal Investigator of the research project, Dr. Madhu Bala Juwantha, and co-investigator, Mr. Parmanand Chauhan. Speakers at the program included Mr. Veer Singh Panwar, Member of the Area Panchayat, and Mr. Vinod Singh Panwar, Horticulture Expert, Village Tipri. Addressing the farmers present, Principal Investigator Dr. Madhu Bala Juwantha stated that the current production of coarse grains is nutritious and beneficial for food and income generation.

Mr. Vinod Singh Pawar, Horticulture Expert, who was present as a resource person, advised farmers to increase the production of Kodo, Jhangora, Konni, and other crops. Coarse grains can meet farmers' dietary needs and increase their income. He explained that some obstacles to production, such as lack of irrigation facilities and attacks by wild animals, pose challenges. By adopting certain measures to overcome these challenges, the production of coarse grains can be increased. He informed the farmers about various farming methods. Addressing the farmers as the keynote speaker, Mr. Veer Singh Pawar, Member of the Area Panchayat, stated that coarse grains are currently fetching good prices in the market. Farmers should focus on growing coarse grains in their fields. He assured that related problems will be brought to the attention of the government through various platforms.

Farmers present at the event stated that the main difficulties in the production of coarse grains such as jhangora, kodo, and cowpea are crop damage by wild animals, pigs, rats, etc., and the lack of irrigation facilities. At the end of the event, co-investigator Parmanand Chauhan stated that the problems and obstacles faced by farmers in the production of coarse grains will be reported to the government through a report. Many farmers from Gram Sabha Ratouli, Tipri etc. including Surendra Lal, Mohanlal, Jodha Kumar, Mekhla Devi, Jashoda Devi, Ganga Devi, Sarojini Devi, Etbar Singh, Arjun Singh etc. were present in the program.
